



InSyst Label Changes Considerations for 2022 and 2023 Use

The InSyst label has been updated under the new MAPP number 19873.

The withdrawal dates for old label InSyst under MAPP number 13414 are; sale and distribution by 30th June 2022 and; disposal, storage and use-up by 30th June 2023.

During the transition period from old to new label product, consideration should be given to the changes to the label which have a significant bearing on how the product can be used, by crop going forward:

- **Sugar beet** can only be treated with new label InSyst (MAPP 19873). Sugar beet was not on the old label and the previous emergency authorisation has expired.
- **Brussel sprouts** can only be treated with old label InSyst (MAPP 13414) under EAMU 2866 of 2007. This EAMU does not apply to new label InSyst.
- **Potatoes** can be treated with either old or new label InSyst but restrictions have been added to new label InSyst (MAPP 19873): an application window of BBCH 40-89 and a minimum interval of 21 days. BBCH 40 is tuber initiation so seed growers can retain the flexibility of old label product by using it during the use-up period until 30th June 2023.
- **Oilseed Rape** can be treated with either old or new label InSyst and although the latest time of application has been changed it is unlikely to be restrictive in practice.
- **All crops** on the new InSyst (MAPP 19873) now have an untreated 5m buffer zone to non-crop land and applications must not be made after 31st July.

While stocks last, and up until 30th June 2022 at the latest Certis has the flexibility to supply old and new label InSyst. This summary should help you place the best labelled product on farm according to intended crop use and enable growers to use up stocks appropriately.
